Heart Force Receives Approval from Health Canada

VANCOUVER, BC— December 1, 2008 Heart Force Medical Inc., a Vancouver-based company that is developing a non-invasive instrument that assesses cardiac performance announced it has received a license from Health Canada to commercialize its technology. Heart Force's digital Ballistocardiography (dBG) device utilizes advances in digital signal processing and computing to detect abnormalities in the efficiency of the heart's performance.

"We are very pleased with this approval by Health Canada" said Adrian Somers, Heart Force's Director of Product Development. "This approval will allow us to expedite our plans to expand our clinical trials thus enhancing our commercialization plans."

"Heart Force will initiate clinical trials into several sites across Canada in 2009. These clinical trials are essential in demonstrating the efficacy of our dBG as a medical device that assists physicians assess a patient's cardiac performance", said Dr. Geoff Houlton, President and CEO. "Securing Health Canada approval is an important step in the evolution of the company. We have a unique technology and this supports our growth and continuing product development efforts."

Between 2000 and 2004, the latest year for which Statistics Canada has data, cardiovascular disease accounted for 380,861 deaths, making it the leading cause of death at 34 per cent of all fatalities.
